- David Coaldrake


- Jon Horbury

At around the age of 4, my dad gave my brother and I a canoe. It was yellow, hand made, vulnerable to leaking and yet one of the best boats I've ever had the pleasure of enjoying. You may know, my brother and I still share a boat and still enjoy our boating together with our combined families after over 50 years.

If you're reading this, I know you too love our sport and love the camaraderie, the challenges and the pure excitement of getting ready for, enjoy the participation of and celebrating race day.
